Welcome to Cuckoo Class

Welcome back. We hope you have all had a lovely summer with your children. We're really excited to get to know them and for the year ahead. We have had such a lovely couple of days with your children – they are all settling really well.

If your child is booked into After School Club and you are picking them up at 3.30, please could you let Community Kids know directly so they are aware.

Timetable

The way we plan our day will enable a smooth transition from Auklet/Barn Owl Class, so there will be a mix of formal teaching, group work and independent activities. We have a visual timetable on the board so the children are able to see the structure of the day and we go through it each morning at register time. We have daily English, Maths, Phonics and Mastering Number lessons. Other curriculum lessons fill the other slots in the timetable.

PE will be on Monday and Friday

Please ensure your child comes to school in their sports kit on Mondays and Fridays. Monday will be a shorter PE session which, if the weather allows, will be an outdoor session so warmer clothes may be needed as the term progresses.

For the first few weeks of this term we *may* be able to go swimming. We will send out an email if this can happen and when the day has been confirmed in which we will swim.

On Thursdays, every other week we will be having a forest school session. Please could the children have a pair of wellies in a named carrier bag kept in school for this.

On Fridays we give out a Star of the Week award. If your child is awarded 'Star of the Week' they will bring a certificate home saying why they have earned it. They will also get to take home the Maths Monster for the weekend. On Fridays the second certificate is for demonstrating one of the school's Learning Behaviours.

What you will need

Bags - Due to limited space, could we request that your child only bring in a book bag with what they need for the day. We simply don't have room for large rucksacks.

It may also be a good idea to keep a separate bag on the children's pegs containing some spare clothes. Accidents can happen and it would be helpful if we could quickly access some of the children's own spare clothes.

Snack and Water bottles - Please bring in a bottle of water and a healthy snack for morning break. We will provide an afternoon snack of fruit or vegetables. Please could water bottles and snack pots be clearly named. We are a nut free school, so please ensure there is nothing containing nuts in your children's snack boxes.

Medication - If your child has any medication that is needed in School eg Inhaler or EpiPen, please can they be taken to the office by a parent in a named container. The office will provide you with a permission form. The same applies for if your child is having any prescribed medication, we can not administer this without a signed consent form which are available from the school office.

Homework

Reading and phonics/spellings

Phonics is the main way of teaching reading in KS1. We will build on what the children have learned previously, practising blending and segmenting words and recognising those tricky words that you just have to know.

Children will be encouraged to put their books into a box when they come into the classroom in the morning. If their books are in that box, they will be changed. Book change day will be in line with the rest of Key Stage 1 and happen on a Monday and Thursday. We would like for the children to try and read at least three times with an adult at home. Reading with your child has such benefits and really sets them up for success in later life, so sharing that time with your child at home is so important.

Throughout the year, some children will move across to our Accelerated Reader scheme. This is when the children will choose their own reading book from the library, based on the level they have been assessed at.

Once they have read the book, they will complete a short comprehension quiz on the computer. If they complete three consecutive quizzes at a pass rate of 80% or above, they will be able to move up a level. If your child is already on this scheme, they will simply continue as they have been doing.

We are beginning to assess the reading levels of all the children and aim to get reading books out by the end of next week.

If you would like to do some extra practice of phonics at home with your child there are lots of online resources/games that they can have a go with. There are some helpful resources/links on the class page of the website.

Later in the year, all Year 1 children and some Year 2 children will have to undertake the phonics screening test. This is a statutory check that all children in Year 1 have to do. They will need to use their phonics skills to read real and nonsense words. Next year, we will be doing lots of practice based around this and will hold an informal information meeting for parents. Year 2 children will be taking part in the optional SATs for reading and maths.

Year 2 children will be given a termly overview of spellings. These are words that we would like them to learn and practise at home each week, writing them out individually and then including them in a sentence. They will have a weekly spelling test on Fridays.

Topic – half termly topic homework will be set. Please see the included letter with further details. These are generally more practical activities which we really hope the children will enjoy doing with you. These are fun tasks which are designed to create a love of learning. You can either photograph and email their activities and we will show them to the class or your child can bring the finished product in.

Behaviour

We follow the school's behaviour policy that is available on the website. We also have a class behaviour chart. The children will all start on 'Ready to fly' and can move themselves up throughout the day if an adult has spotted them following our class rules that are agreed by the children at the beginning of the year. When the child reaches the top of the chart, they will receive a special sticker at the end of the day. If a child needs to think about their behaviour choices, they will be given a warning and a private discussion will be had with the child. If the behaviour continues they may be asked to move themselves down on the chart. This gives the child the responsibility of making the correct choice. If the choice is corrected, their name immediately moves back up to ready to fly and can continue as normal. If their name reaches the red sign, the teacher will decide what is going to happen next. This may be a phone call to parents, or a conversation with the head of school. All decisions will be made aware to the child so they know they have a choice.

When a child moves up a stage on the behaviour ladder, they also get a house point. The children all belong to a house team and the points that they earn are added to those of the other children in their 'house' in different year groups. At the end of the week, the total number of house points are read out to the whole school.

Show and share

Throughout the year we will run a Show and Share rota. This will give the children a chance to bring in or talk about something of interest to them. Each child should get a chance across the year for this and all the information is on a separate sheet which is sent home as a hard copy. This was a really big success last year as the children really enjoyed sharing their special interests with their friends. In the Spring term, we will change to 'Show and Share a Story' in which the children will bring in their favourite story from home to share with their classmates.
